St. Peters Sewer

A sump pump that is connected to the sanitary sewer is defeating the purpose of keeping your basement dry as it could result in it flooding with sewage and dirty water.

It is therefore critical that sump pumps discharge to your yard, the ditch, or the storm sewer and not to the sanitary sewer.

Certain effluents are not allowed to be discharged into central treatment facilities and they can be harmful and create an added burden on the treatment process.

For example, storm water and surface water runoff, solvents, items that can obstruct flow or interfere with pumping facilities, toxic materials, certain chemicals, and animal wastes can be damaging to the system.

A customer's service can be suspended if they are discharging prohibited matter.

The unnecessary water, ie: sump pump water adds significant stress on the municipal system and causes pumps to work harder than normal and increases electricity costs and maintenance. problems. These extra costs could influence future rates from the utility.

Community Cupboard Donations

We greatly appreciate the donations to our Community Cupboard to help support the individuals and families accessing it. As the Community Cupboard is done on a volunteer basis, we ask that donations be made at our designated time to collect them. It is so wonderful to see the steady flow of drop-offs, but it can be quite challenging to complete the administrative work that is necessary with multiple drop-offs a day and limited office hours. We also ask that it continues to be food only donations as we do not accept clothing or other items because we have limited space. Please make your Community Cupboard drop offs on Tuesday(s) between the hours of 2 – 5 pm at the side door of the Dr. Roddie Community Centre.



Off-Season Access

All Parks Canada visitor facilities and washrooms are closed for the off season. Visitors are still welcome to use PEI National Park trails and access the beaches during the winter months. Visitors are reminded that they are responsible for their own safety and to plan accordingly.

During the winter months, snow will be cleared from the Gulf Shore Parkway between Cavendish and North Rustico and between Brackley and Dalvay.

The following parking areas are also plowed:

- Greenwich Interpretation Centre Dalvay Beach
- Bubbling Springs/Farmland Trailhead Ross Lane Beach (South Lot)
- Shaws Beach Brackley Beach
- Cavendish Beach North Rustico Beach (paved area)

Trails are not maintained, and emergency services are limited throughout the winter. All off-season visitors should be prepared for harsh weather and natural hazards. Cellular service can be unreliable in parts of PEI National Park. Remember to let someone know where you are going and your anticipated return time before you set out on an adventure.

No Domestic Animals on Beach Starting April 1st:

To provide a safe environment for visitors and to protect wildlife and their habitats, domestic animals are not permitted on the beaches of PEI National Park from April 1 to October 15. The presence of dogs and other domestic animals on beaches can cause disturbance to wildlife, including the endangered Piping Plover.

Dogs are permitted in all other outdoor areas of the park. Visitors are reminded that all pets must be on a leash at all times (maximum length 3 metres) and owners are required to clean up after their pet.

Early Bird Pass Sales Begin April 2nd:

Parks Canada is offering season entry passes for Prince Edward Island National Park at discounted rates prior to the beginning of the 2024 operating season. Season passes offer unlimited access to PEI National Park in 2024, including beaches, trails, visitor services, and facilities.

Season entry passes for PEI National Park will go on sale April 2nd at www.parksorders.ca. They will also be available for purchase at Ardgowan National Historic Site in Charlottetown Monday to Friday 8:30am-4:30pm. Passes can be purchased at the Greenwich Interpretation Centre when it opens for the season in early June.

Protecting the Dunes:

Dune closures are in effect throughout the off-season. It is prohibited to walk on any part of the sand dunes as they remain fragile year-round. We all have an important part to play in protecting these important wildlife habitats and unique natural features. Thank you to all who continue to protect these treasured areas.

Keep and Eye Out for Piping Plovers:

Beginning in mid-April, endangered Piping Plovers start returning to PEI. They nest on sandy beaches and use gravel and broken seashells to help disguise the location of their eggs. Ensuring an undisturbed nesting area goes a long way to fostering a successful recovery for this species at risk.

If you find yourself on a beach where Piping Plovers are nesting, you can help by respecting closed areas. If you think you may have found an unprotected nest, report it to Parks Canada at 902-672-6350.

Other Parks Canada News:

Campground reservations for the 2024 season in PEI National Park are open. Reservations can be made by calling the Parks Canada Reservation service at 1-877-737-3783, or online at reservation.pc.gc.ca.

Green Gables Heritage Place is open by special appointment starting April 15th, additional fees apply. For more information or to make a reservation e-mail greengables@pc.gc.ca. Green Gables will be open for general admission starting May 1st.

Meals on Wheels PEI is the collaborative leader for the delivery of nutritious and affordable meals, to persons in need, to facilitate the promotion of health and wellness across Prince Edward Island. Since 2022, the Association has been working with 12 Meals on Wheels Chapters across the province to offer support, stabilize operations and enhance programming for clients and volunteers.

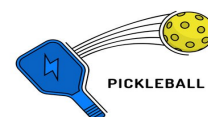

Canadian Centre for Climate Change and Adaption

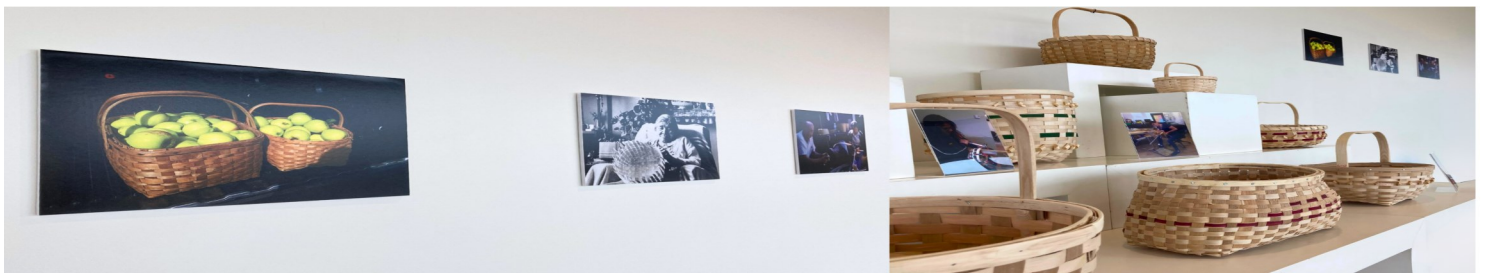
Wisqoq, The Basket Tree

Solo exhibition by: Climate Artist-in-Residence, Elder Francis Jadis

**On view at the Canadian Centre for Climate Change and Adaptation art gallery
March 15 - May 7, 2024**

Wisqoq (Black Ash) is a tree species specially adapted to grow in water-saturated soils. Once plentiful, Wisqoq graced the banks of rivers and wet forests across the maritimes and throughout Turtle Island. For millennia Wisqoq has been harvested by the Mi'kmaq for basketry, canoe construction and much more, but are now in decline due to climate change-induced environmental stressors. Climate Artist-in-Residence, Elder Francis Jadis has been harvesting Wisqoq in Northern Maine his whole life, but his ability to do so has become increasingly complicated due to Climate Change. 'Wisqoq, The Basket Tree' showcases a collection of intricately woven baskets displayed alongside family photographs, highlighting the rich tradition of skill-sharing and storytelling inherent in basket weaving.

For the month of April we also have Nature PEI's Travelling Museum of Endangered Species on display in our lobby. The gallery at the Canadian Centre for Climate Change and Adaptation is open every Friday from 9:30 AM to 4:00 PM. 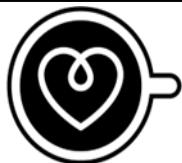

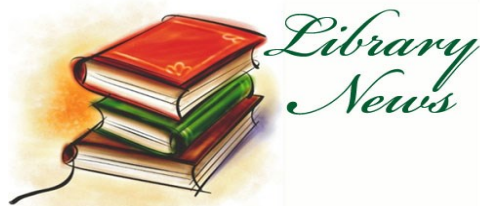

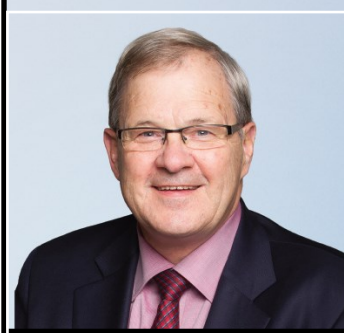

Department News:

- St. Peter's Fire Department continues to try to recruit new members. If you think you may be interested in joining or have some questions, please contact Chief Craig Campbell (902-393-2870) or any Firefighter to get more information.
- Fire season began on March 15, 2024. Burning permits are not required for Category 1 fires (domestic brush burning); however, you must check the burn restrictions each day prior to burning. **Category 1 fires are:**
 - ◆ Piles no larger than three metres in diameter,
 - ◆ Piles no more than two metres high,
 - ◆ Multiple piles must be at least 10 metres apart from each other.
 - ◆ No more than two piles burning at one time,
 - ◆ Burning of tree limbs, leaves, brush or cut grass is permitted,
 - ◆ Fire must be attended at all times.
- As of March 15, burning permits are required for Category 2, 3 and 4 fires. Please apply online, or visit your local district forestry office to apply (Southampton 2580 Rte 313) call ahead at 902-961-7296. Additionally, for Categories 2,3 and 4, you must check the Fire Weather Index (FWI) prior to burning.

We all have a part to play when it comes to preventing wildfire and reducing risk.
