Off-Season Access

While Prince Edward Island National Park remains open for visitors to continue to enjoy, facilities and washrooms in the park are closed until the spring. Visitors are still welcome to use the PEI National Park trail system and access many beaches during the winter months.

Please note that trails and access points are not groomed or maintained over the winter months, and emergency services are limited. All off-season guests should take the necessary precautions to protect themselves from harsh weather and potential natural hazards found in the park. Cellular service can be unreliable in parts of PEI National Park. Remember to let someone know where you are going and your anticipated return time before you set out on an adventure. All park users are responsible for their own safety and should plan ahead.

Wildlife in PEI National Park

December to March is seal pupping season in Atlantic Canada. Seals to watch for include harbour seals, harp seals, grey seals, hooded seals and their pups. But please keep in mind the following:

- While seals spend most of their time in the water, it is completely normal for them to come ashore to rest.
- Do not approach seals on the beach. It is important to remember that seals are wild animals and can act aggressively if they feel threatened. As always, give wildlife their space.
- It is illegal to feed, entice or disturb wildlife. The minimum fine is \$275.
- If you see evidence of injury or illness, including wounds, crusty eyes or malnourishment, call Parks Canada's Dispatch Line: 1-877-852-3100.

Dogs and Domestic Animals

To protect wildlife and the park's fragile natural ecosystem, dogs and other domestic animals must remain on-leash at all times anywhere in PEI National Park—including all trails and beaches. Pet owners are required to clean up after their pets. During the off-season, some waste receptacles have been removed and owners must be prepared to pack out any waste from their visit.

Protecting the Dunes

Dune closures are in effect throughout the off-season. It is prohibited to walk on any part of the sand dunes as they remain fragile year-round. We all have an important part to play in protecting these important wildlife habitats and unique natural features. Thank you to all who continue to protect these treasured areas.

Season entry passes for PEI National Park will go on sale April 1st at www.parksorders.ca. They will also be available for purchase at Ardgowan National Historic Site in Charlottetown Monday to Friday 8:30am-4:30pm. Passes can be purchased at the Greenwich Interpretation Centre when it opens for the season³ in early June.

Some of the more popular items are:

Puddings, wagon wheels, granola bars, goldfish crackers, jello packs, fruit cups (anything for kids lunches goes pretty fast).

Kraft dinner, canned ham, chicken or turkey, tuna, salmon, bread, cereal, cheese, eggs, milk, French fries, frozen dinners, pizza, fruit and meat.

Toiletries are also picked up quickly ; Kleenex and toilet paper are also needed. **We don't monitor the people coming in to get food but we also don't put everything out at once so we try to ensure that everyone who needs food has a chance to get some.**

The residents and local businesses have been generous with their food and monetary donations and it is appreciated. We now have an email account so if you would like to make a monetary donation you can e-transfer baycupboard@hotmail.com and it will automatically be deposited to the account at Morell Credit Union.

The Health Equipment Loan Program (HELP) of the Canadian Red Cross allows people to return home from hospital earlier or recover more safely at home from serious injury, illness or surgery, and gives independence and dignity to those in palliative care.

Individuals can receive short-term loans of mobility and safety devices such as wheelchairs, walkers, bath seats, benches, commodes and toilet seats, crutches and canes, bed handles and other durable medical equipment.

This month`s Safety tips

· Carbon monoxide, also known as CO, is called the “Invisible Killer” because it's a colorless, odorless, poisonous gas. More than 150 people in the Unites States die every year from accidental nonfire-related CO poisoning associated with consumer products, including generators. Other products include faulty, improperly-used or incorrectly-vented fuel-burning appliances such as furnaces, stoves, water heaters and fireplaces. Install a CO detector on each floor and test them regularly.

· If you are installing your own dryer, follow the manufacturer’s instructions before installing the dryer vent. Determine the straightest and most direct venting path to the outdoors to reduce the likelihood of lint accumulation in bends or elbows. Inspect and clean the lint screen after each load of laundry. The build-up of lint can lead to a fire. Regularly remove lint from metal ducts and exhaust vents!
